Technical Specification

1. The Skin should stitch able foam to provide a lifelike suturing experience for students or a realistic suturing demonstration by an instructor
2. Soft and pliable for easy sewing, the skin is tough enough that sutures will not pull out when tightened.
3. The manikins are provided with“wounds.” These “wounds” can be sutured repeatedly until the skin around them is finally worn out; then, new “wounds” can be cut several times
